

There is still time to donate to our President's Appeal and receive a tax receipt for 2025. The deadline is December 12th for this tax year.






CRAFT FAIR VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

She is a graduate of the Faculty of Music in Performance at University of Toronto and the MBA program at the Schulich School of Business, York University. She also studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music as well as with USC clarinetist Mitchell Lurie in Los Angeles. A recipient of the Canada Council's John Hobday Award and the Queen's Human Rights Initiative Award, Tricia embraces lifelong learning and a complete passion for music.

Dean Tricia Baldwin, with her remarkable colleagues at the Victoria Conservatory of Music, envision a world of possibilities for the role of music and music education in society. This is a most exciting and challenging time for the arts, filled with disruptors that have inspired and required new thinking about the essential role of culture and inclusive education in our society. Examining the rapidly changing landscape for the arts, Tricia discusses our collective responsibility in music education to take the steps now required for the creation of the future we so passionately desire for our students and a healthy society. She will ask the participants in this session, "If, together, we get things right, what is <u>your</u> vision for 20<u>35</u> for the arts and arts education in our society in the future?"

Diana Schaffter, an American citizen, lived in North Korea freely for two years, while accompanying her husband, Tim Schaffter, a Canadian, who was the head of the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) there.

Diana and Tim have lived in Asia and Eastern Europe for 40 years: Thailand, Vietnam, Romania, India, Kyrgyzstan, Laos and North Korea. Tim worked with the United Nations for 26 years—22 years with UNICEF. Diana worked as an international educator, founding two pre-schools, and serving as an educational consultant to Governments.


