

Tricia Baldwin is a distinguished arts leader with a career spanning top Canadian institutions. She is a graduate of the Faculty of Music in Performance at University of Toronto and the MBA program at the Schulich School of Business, York University. She also studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music as well as with USC clarinetist Mitchell Lurie in Los Angeles. A recipient of the Canada Council's John Hobday Award and the Queen's Human Rights Initiative Award, Tricia embraces lifelong learning and a complete passion for music.

Dean Tricia Baldwin, with her remarkable colleagues at the Victoria Conservatory of Music, envision a world of possibilities for the role of music and music education in society. This is a most exciting and challenging time for the arts, filled with disruptors that have inspired and required new thinking about the essential role of culture and inclusive education in our society. Examining the rapidly changing landscape for the arts, Tricia discusses our collective responsibility in music education to take the steps now required for the creation of the future we so passionately desire for our students and a healthy society. She will ask the participants in this session, "If, together, we get things right, what is <u>your</u> vision for 20<u>35</u> for the arts and arts education in our society in the future?"

Guest Speaker Chris Kilford, CD, PhD

President, Canadian International Council, Victoria Branch

"The geopolitical challenges of today!"

The geopolitical challenges today are seemingly endless. Indeed, from Washington, to Moscow, Beijing, Kyiv and beyond, countries are burning the midnight oil as they seek a way out of the turbulent times we live in. Over the past 18 months, our speaker travelled to Turkiye, Taiwan, South Korea, Japan and Bhutan on official and semi-official visits, where he had a chance to sit down with numerous officials including Canada's Ambassador to Turkiye, Kevin Hamilton, to Taiwan's Vice Minister of Foreign Affairs, Remus Li-Kuo Chen. Chris also spent two weeks in Poland and Latvia, meeting officials from both countries and visiting members of the Canadian Armed Forces who are training Ukrainian military personnel and leading NATO's Multinational Brigade in Latvia. During his talk, Chris will speak about his various visits, what he learned while on the ground and what are the key geopolitical issues we should be aware of today.

Chris is a member of the national board of the Canadian International Council, the editor of CIC's online foreign policy magazine Open Canada, president of the CIC Victoria branch and a sessional professor with the Canadian Forces College, where he teaches courses focused on Canadian foreign and defence policy. He also holds a PhD in history from Queen's University with a focus on civil-military relations in the developing world. Chris enjoyed a 36-year career in the Canadian Army, commanding 4th Air Defence Regiment, followed by various senior positions in the Department of National Defence, including Director, Future Security Analysis and Military Liaison Officer to the Senate Committee on National Security and Defence. From July 2009 until July 2010, Chris deployed to Canada's Embassy in Kabul, Afghanistan as the Deputy Military Attaché. On his return to Canada, he commenced Turkish language training, after which he was sent to Canada's Embassy in Ankara as the Canadian Defence Attaché with cross accreditation to Azerbaijan, Georgia, and Turkmenistan. He was in this post from July 2011 until July 2014. Chris retired from the military in September 2014.

Jen is an ESMTT (Essential Somatics ^R Movement¹ Teacher in Training). "For many years I had felt unbalanced in my body but could not find out why. In 2023 I found Essential Somatics and then began studying with founder Martha Pederson. I am excited to have found a practice that explains what is happening in my body as I age and gives me movement tools to combat the effects of everyday life and injury. I am thrilled to share this with others."
